For each of your assigned revolutions, complete the following, and share with me, as a Google doc or word doc.

Independent Movements/Revolutions:

1. Haitian Revolution (slave revolt and independence)
2. Venezuelan Revolution/War for Independence
3. Mexican War for Independence (1800s)
4. Brazilian Revolution

A. Complete the following (can be bulleted statements, charts, webs, etc):

1. Context in which revolution or independent movement(s) occurred-political, social, intellectual, connection to events in Europe and the colonies, organization and nature of colonial unrest and conflict.
2. Causes of the revolution (SPICE)
3. Important people and (societal groups) and their role in the revolution
4. Goals of the revolution
5. Results of revolution (SPICE)-who gained and who lost? Status quo?
6. Timeline of major events

B. Conclusion and Analysis (fully explained and written out):

1. Justification and analysis of revolution
 - a. What were the changes (if any) in the structure of the governments?
 - b. To what extent (if at all) did the leaders borrow ideas, tactics, anything from one another?
 - c. What changes (if any) were there in citizenship? In individuals' rights?
 - d. What economic and social changes were there (if any)? What groups gained and what groups in society lost?
 - e. What was the fate of the "losers" in the revolutionary struggle?
 - f. What was the fate of the institution of slavery?
2. Comparison to the American and French Revolutions-Radicalism? Was this a revolution or an independence movement? What radical changes did or did not occur? What fundamentally changed? What stayed the same? Why?
3. Global impact?
