Big Picture

At the beginning of the 20th century, a European dominated political order existed, which also included the United States, Russia, and Japan. Over the course of the century, peoples and states around the world challenged this order in ways that sought to redistribute power within the existing order and to restructure empires, while those peoples and states in power attempted to maintain the status quo. These challenges to, and the attempts to maintain, the political order manifested themselves in an unprecedented level of conflict with high human casualties.
