- 3. How does this perception of Japan perpetuate the ideas that Europe was the savior of Japan and therefore the creator of a new "civilized" Japan?
- 4. As states in Totman's article, "Why does the notion of Japan's isolationism endure? What purpose does it serve? What interests or convictions (firm beliefs) does it perpetuate?
- 5. Identify patterns/continuities in Japanese culture displayed during this period in history.

- Annotate the articles with the purpose of answering, "Was Japan a "closed" country?"Be able to cite evidence from specific articles.
